Georgia Title	No Will	1. Certified Copy of Death Certificate 2. T-20 Affidavit 3. Lien Release (if applicable) 4. Georgia Title (if available) 5. MV-16 Family Affidavit (if applicable)	<p>The inheritor <u>must</u> title vehicle in his/her name prior to transferring ownership.</p> <p>Note: If the vehicle is jointly owned and the surviving owner and the inheritor are not the same, the inheritor must sign as seller to transfer vehicle to surviving owner. If ownership is being transferred to a third party , both must sign the Georgia title to transfer ownership.</p>

MV-16 Family Affidavit (if applicable)	<p>The inheritor <u>must</u> title vehicle in his/her name prior to transferring ownership.</p> <p>Note: If the vehicle is jointly owned and the surviving owner and the inheritor are not the same, the inheritor must sign as seller to transfer vehicle to surviving owner. If ownership is being transferred to a third party , both must sign the Georgia title to transfer ownership.</p>
Georgia Title	Probated Will	1. Certified copy of Letters of Testamentary/Administration 2. Lien Release (if applicable) 3. Georgia Title (if available) 4. MV-16 Family Affidavit (if applicable)	<p>If the Georgia title is available, the Executor may complete the assignment on the back of the title to transfer ownership and declare the odometer. If the title is <u>not</u> available <u>and</u> the odometer declaration is required, the Executor <u>must</u> title vehicle in his/her name before transferring ownership.</p> <p>If the odometer declaration is <u>not</u> required, the Executor may complete the assignment on the back of the title (if available) or provide the purchaser a bill of sale.</p> <p>Note: If the vehicle is jointly owned and the surviving owner and the executor are not the same, the executor must sign as seller to transfer vehicle to surviving owner. If ownership is being transferred to a third party , both must sign the Georgia title to transfer ownership.</p>
Georgia Title w/Year's Support	Probated Will	1. Certified Copy of Year's Support 2. Title (if available) 3. Lien Release (if applicable) 4. MV-16 Family Affidavit (if applicable)	<p>If a year's support is submitted, the person granted the Year's Support <u>must</u> title the vehicle in his/her name before transferring ownership. The Year's Support <u>must</u> reflect a complete description of the vehicle (year, model, make and vehicle identification number).</p>

Georgia Non-Titled Vehicle	Any	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Certified Copy of Death Certificate 2. T-20 Affidavit of Inheritance 3. Bill of Sale (if applicable) 4. Copy of Will (if applicable) 5. Certified copy of Letters of Testamentary (if applicable) 6. Title (if applicable) 	<p>The vehicle may be registered as a non-titled vehicle in the inheritor's name or ownership may be transferred with a bill of sale completed by the inheritor/Executor.</p> <p>Note: If the vehicle is jointly owned <u>and</u> the surviving owner and Executor/Inheritor are not the same, the Executor/Inheritor must sign as seller. If ownership is being transferred to a third party , both <u>must</u> sign the Georgia title (if available) or bill of sale to transfer ownership.</p>
Out-of-State Titles	Probated Will	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Original MSO or Out-of-State title in the deceased person's name or assigned to the deceased person. 2. Lien Release (if applicable) 3. Certified copy of Letters of Testamentary/Administration 	<p>The Executor must complete the assignment on the back of the out-of-state title to transfer ownership and declare the odometer.</p> <p>Note: If the vehicle is jointly owned <u>and</u> the surviving owner and Executor are not the same, the Executor and surviving owner must sign the back of the title to transfer ownership.</p>
Out-of-State Titles	No Will or Will Not-Probated	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Original MSO or Out-of-State title in the deceased person's name or assigned to the deceased person. 2. Copy of the Will 3. Lien Release (if applicable) 4. Certified Copy of Death Certificate 5. T-20 Affidavit of Inheritance (if applicable) 	<p>A Georgia title can <u>only</u> be issued if the inheritor is a Georgia resident.</p> <p>The inheritor must title the vehicle in his/her name in his/her home state before transferring ownership to a Georgia resident.</p>
